French - Year 3 - Fruits and vegetables/Hungry Giant - Summer 1

Prior Learning: Children have a basic understanding about counting and asking questions.

Fruit in France:

The main fruits grown in France are apples (58%), melons (10%), peaches and nectarines (10%), apricots (5%), and kiwifruits (5%), alongside smaller volumes of plums, strawberries, grapes, walnuts, and cherries

4. TWAL: I can ask politely for a fruit or vegetable

We will play bingo to try and remember the names of fruit and vegetables. We will then learn how to be polite when asking for fruit and vegetables.



Je veux = I want. This isn't polite.

1. TWAL: I can understand and say fruit and vegetable nouns

In this lesson we will learn some names of fruit and vegetables. We will also try and understand the colours of them. We will try to listen attentively and identify key sounds and silent letters.

5. TWAL: I can remember fruit and vegetable nouns

We will practise being polite when asking for fruit and vegetables and play a game using all our knowledge.

2. TWAL: I can count fruits and vegetables

We will learn numbers 1-15 and link this to fruit and vegetables. We will try to recall previously learnt language and listen attentively.

6. TWAL: I can write sentences using a model

In this lesson we will be using a model to write a sentence about what the giant wants to eat. Then we could try to write our own sentence. We will try to speak confidently and recall previously learnt language.

3. TWAL: I can understand a story about fruits and vegetables

In this lesson we will read a story about a hungry giant and use our knowledge from lessons 1 and 2. We will try to listen attentively, make educated guesses and join in with language games.
