Year 1 (Summer 2) Respectful Relationships and Sex Education

Prior Learning: In Year R children will have learnt about Looking after ourselves, basic hygiene routines and why it is important to keep clean. They will have also recognised all families are different. PANTS- Stand up, speak out NSPCC workshops will have been provided.

We will learn and understand how important it is to develop healthy relationships in a variety of contexts and to know when to seek help. We will learn how to stay safe and to be able to make age appropriate informed decisions. We will learn how it feels to enjoy positive relationships of all different kinds.

This includes learning about understanding different ways we can look after ourselves. We will learn to understand basic hygiene routines and why it is important for us to keep clean. We will be able to explore and recognize that all families are different. PANTS- Stand up, speak out NSPCC workshops.

1. TWAL: The importance of basic hygiene

We will be learning to understand the importance of basic hygiene eg, why it is important to wash our hands after using the toilet, wiping ourselves correctly after using the toilet, making sure we have a good hygiene routine when we are at home as well as at school
