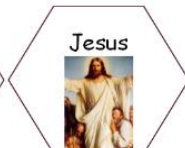
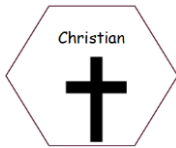


Prior Learning: Celebrating new life at Easter

Words we will know!



1. Communicate: When have I been sad then happy?
TWAL: to communicate our ideas about sad and happy.

We will talk about our own experiences of sad then happy. We could show this through artwork.

5. Evaluate: Do we think it is important for Christians to feel sad then happy at Easter?

TWAL: to understand the importance of happiness and sadness for Christians at Easter.

We will talk about the importance of the feelings of sadness and happiness to Christians when they remember the Easter story.

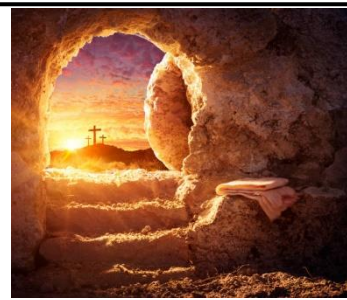
2. Apply: What different things make people sad then happy?
TWAL: to apply our understanding of sad and happy

We will identify feelings of sadness/happiness in different situations and for different people.

Theme: Easter

Concept: Sad and Happy

Easter is celebrated by most Christians and usually happens in April.



4. Contextualise: What are the sad and happy parts of the Easter story?

TWAL: to contextualise happy and sad for Christians in the Easter story.

We will be able to recognise how sadness and happiness are important in the Easter story.

It is happy in the Easter story when Jesus comes back to life.

3. Inquire: What is sadness and happiness?
TWAL: to inquire about sadness and happiness

We will identify and talk about the concepts of sadness and happiness. We will look at examples of these in stories.
