Theme: Guru Nanak and the Gurus

Concept: Wisdom: How do the Gurus show wisdom?

Guru Nanak was a wise man who founded Sikhism. Sikhism was based on the 9 Gurus who followed him.



2. Contextualise: How did the Sikh Gurus show wisdom?

TWAL: to contextualise wisdom in the Sikh faith.
