4. Communicate: What do we believe?
TWAL: to communicate our ideas about belief.

We will describe what we believe in.



It is okay for everyone to believe different things.

3. Evaluate: What do we think about Christians beliefs?
TWAL: to evaluate the importance of belief for Christians.

We will evaluate the concept of belief by describing how it is important to Christians in the Easter story.



It is important for Christians to believe in Jesus coming back to life at Easter time because all of Christianity is built on this belief.

5. Apply: How does what we believe affect what we do?
TWAL: to apply our understanding of belief to the lives of others.

We will identify times in our lives that it is important to believe something and times that it is not important to believe something. We will identify how belief relates to our lives and the lives of others.

Theme: Easter

Concept: Belief

Christians today celebrate Jesus' new life on Easter Sunday and give Easter eggs as a sign of new life.



2. Contextualise: What beliefs do Christians have about Jesus in the Easter events?
TWAL: to contextualise belief for Christians at Easter.

We will read the story of Palm Sunday and be able to retell this. We will be able to identify the ways in which belief is shown in this story.



The disciples believed in Jesus when he told them not to worry about him.

1. Inquire: What does belief mean?
TWAL: to inquire about belief

We will explore the concept of belief through sorting statements onto a belief line. We will be able to identify and talk about the concept of belief.
