1. Communicate

TWAL: to communicate our understanding of remembering.

We will build on our knowledge of remembering from the Passover unit about be able to discuss confidently what this concept means to us.

5. Evaluate

TWAL: to evaluate the importance of Shabbat for Jewish people.

We will answer the question "Why do you think Jewish people celebrate Shabbat?" We will be able to say how important remembering is for Jewish people.

2. Apply

TWAL: to apply our understanding of remembering.

We will identify what it is important to remember and when.

4. Contextualise

TWAL: to contextualise Shabbat for Jewish people.

We will learn that Shabbat helps Jewish people to remember creation and the day of rest. It is usually celebrated through a special meal.

Jewish people believe that God created the world in 6 days and rested on the 7th. Christians also believe this.

3. Inquire

TWAL: to inquire about remembering.

We will identify and talk about words linked to remembering. We will discuss ideas for things that we need to remember and how we can remember them.
