### 4. Communicate

TWAL: communicate our own ideas about faith.

We will describe our personal response to faith through expressing our own words that we feel are connected to faith.

### 3. Evaluate

TWAL: to evaluate the importance of faith to Christians.

We will describe the importance of faith to Christians through ordering cards about The Annunciation into true, false or maybe and giving reasons to explain our ideas.



This story is important to Christians because it teaches Christians to have faith in God's plans and promises.

# 5. Apply

TWAL: to apply the concept of faith to our own lives.

We will describe examples of how faith might affect our own lives and the lives of others. Theme: Christmas: The Annunciation (visit of the Angel Gabriel to Mary to announce the Incarnation).

Concept: Faith

The Annunciation is when Christians believe that the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would be giving birth to the Son of God, Jesus. This is celebrated by most Christians at Christmas although the feast of the Annunciation is usually celebrated by some Christians in March.

#### 2. Contextualise

TWAL: to contextualise faith for Christians at Christmas

We will re-explore Matthew and Luke's Gospel of the birth narrative and describe how the concept of faith is expressed.
