

3. Evaluate

TWAL: to evaluate the importance of temptation for Christians.

We will be able to describe why it is or isn't important for Christians to recognise that Jesus was tempted.



Jesus not being tempted teaches Christians to follow his example to rid themselves of evil.

4. Communicate

TWAL: to communicate our ideas about temptation.

We will be able to describe how we feel when we are tempted.

5. Apply

TWAL: to apply our understanding of temptation.

We will be able to describe a situation where someone might be tempted.

Theme: Making Choices

Concept: Temptation

We are looking at the Christian belief that Jesus was tempted by the devil. Christians believe in stories from the old and new testament. Jewish people believe the stories in the old testament.



2. Contextualise

TWAL: to contextualise temptation in the Christian faith.

We will listen to the stories of Jesus' temptations from the new testament then be able to describe how Christians believe Jesus was tempted.

We will read and role play the story of the golden calf from the old testament and discuss how Jewish people were tempted in this story.

1. Inquire

TWAL: to inquire into temptation.

We will discover what temptation means through playing a game. We will be able to describe what it means.
