## Words we will know!



### 1. Communicate

TWAL: to communicate our ideas about stewardship.

We will learn that stewardship is when we look after something that is not ours. We will think of examples of when we have done this in our own lives.

### 5. Evaluate

TWAL: to evaluate the importance of Stewardship.

We will describe and explain the importance and relevance of Stewardship to Muslims and ourselves.

### 2. Apply

TWAL: To apply our understanding of stewardship to others.

We will think about the pros and cons of looking after something that belongs to someone else.

Theme: Creation

Concept: stewardship

In Islam there is no single creation story, but instead there are references to Allah creating the world and all living creatures in 6 days. This is similar to the Christian and Jewish belief of how the world was created.

### 4. Contextualise

TWAL: to contextualise stewardship for Muslims.

We will learn that Muslims believe that it is the job of everyone to look after the world.

### 3. Inquire

TWAL: to inquire about stewardship.

We will explore the concept of stewardship through learning about looking after the planet. We will be able to describe and explain what stewardship is.



Stewardship is where we are trusted to look after something.



For Muslims Stewardship (khalifah) means looking after something that does not belong to you, thinking of future generations.
