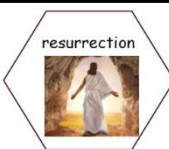

4. Communicate – what are our ideas about resurrection?

TWAL: to communicate our ideas of resurrection.

We will be able to explain our own responses to the concept of resurrection.

3. Evaluate – Why is resurrection important to Christians.

TWAL: to evaluate the importance of resurrection for Christians.

We will evaluate the significance of resurrection by explaining its importance to Christians by thinking about the importance of the resurrection of Aslan in The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe.



Christians believe that Jesus' resurrection has opened up the possibility of eternal life for them.

5. Apply – How does what we believe affect our lives?

TWAL: apply our understanding of resurrection to the lives of others.

We will be able to explain how responses to the idea of resurrection affect the way people live.

Theme: The empty cross

Concept: Jesus' Resurrection

Most Christians believe that Jesus was resurrected (brought back to life) on Easter Sunday.



2. Contextualise – What do we think the cross means?

TWAL: to contextualise resurrection in the Christian faith.

We will learn about Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday through reading the Easter story.



The empty cross is a symbol of the resurrection for all Christians.

1. Inquire – What is resurrection?

TWAL: to inquire into resurrection.

We will learn what resurrection is through looking at the resurrection of Aslan in The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe.
