Year Group	Book	Costume
Year R	The Tiger Who Came to Tea	Come dressed for a tea party or, if you would like to be more adventurous, dressed as a tiger!
Year 1	Smeds and Smedos	Come dressed as a Smed (in red) or a Smoo (in blue) OR your favourite character from a Julia Donaldson book. There are lots to choose from including: The Gruffalo, Stick Man, Zog and many more.
Year 2	S S S S S S S S S S S S S S S S S S S	Come dressed as sailors, pirates or as an adventurer (the children could wear their own clothes for this).
Year 3	Tin Forest	Come dressed in bright colours or as forest animals.
Year 4	ESTE ALL WONDERS	Come dressed as a school pupil (non-school uniform), as a teacher or as an astronaut.
Year 5	SHOW AND TELL	Children should come to school in non-school uniform and bring their own weird, wacky and wonderful 'show and tells' to show the class.

- We will be sending out a google questionnaire about this shortly and would very much appreciate if you could take the time to complete it so we know your thoughts on this.








Parent Forum
