#### **Instrument Lessons**

Letters will be

going out soon to see who would like to learn an instrument in school from September. We offer the following instruments:

Y2 – violin (beginners)

Y3 – violin, viola or cello (beginners and continuers)

Y4 – violin, viola or cello to continue, beginner woodwind (flute or clarinet), beginner trumpet, beginner cello

Y5 – all instrument players who are continuing, beginner guitar

Y6 – all instrument players who are continuing

Our lessons take place with visiting instrumental teachers from Southampton Music Service. Having groups of learners allows us to keep the cost as low as possible. There is a different rate for children who receive the Pupil Premium. Please look out for the letters in your child's bag straight after the half term break, which will contain all the information
