

## Rule for Spelling

For the children to remind themselves about the long vowel and short vowel sounds, please direct them to this video. We have been using this video in class.

Putting this into practise, the words below have short vowel sounds. So when you add a suffix (ed, er or ing) you need to double the last letter of the word. See the example below.

Double up (short vowel)	
hop	hopping
sit	sitting

If the word does not have a short vowel sound, such as these words below, you do not need to double the last letter. You just add the suffix.

No double up	
look	looking
play	playing

Notice how all of the words in the spelling list below have all have a letter that has been doubled before the suffix has been added on.
