### **English**

We will be exploring narratives and writing our own 'missing chapter' based on the book Holes by Louis Sachar as well as writing entertaining poems.

#### French

We will be learning the vocabulary for different fruits and vegetables. We will use this vocabulary to take part in a simple shopping conversation and apply our knowledge to learn how to give instructions for a recipe in French.

#### Music

We will be exploring choral music by various composers such as Handel and Elgar. We will also be exploring and recreating the theme music to 'Doctor Who'. The children will complete listening tasks, draw out graphic scores and have the opportunity to compose their own short pieces using different styles and starting points.

## **PSHE**

We cover how information is stored and used, how to assess and access the reliability of information and to be able to protect ourselves on line by understanding the influences of extreme views within the 'Digital Literacy and Communication' theme of our

### Computing

We will plan, film and edit our own videos. We will evaluate the effectiveness of our video editing skills.

#### RE

We will be looking at the Buddist teaching Dukka (suffering). The concept of dukkha is one of the fundamental teachings of Buddhism. Suffering comes from craving things and also from events in a person's life, such as birth, old age and death.

# Reading

We will develop our reading aloud skills ensuring we use intonation and expression. We will also work on our prediction and summarising skills.

#### **Maths**

The children will be looking at:

- Multiplication and division methods
- Fractions
- Decimals and percentages

### Geography

We will be learning about what makes Great Britain. We will learn about human and physical features and where these are located in the country. We will compare London, Southampton and Lyndhurst, thinking about the physical and human geography.

### Science

We will be learning about the properties of different materials. We will be using this knowledge to separate materials and investigate reversible and irreversible changes.

### Art

We will be composing interesting landscapes focusing on how we can create perspective in our work. We will apply the skills we have learned to our own watercolour paintings.
