English

Our work this term will focus on the theme of 'Remembrance' to present and develop key skills. We will use a variety of forms, including 'Fake News', to further our cohesive and effective writing.

Computing

This unit progresses our knowledge and understanding of the following: digital writing, digital painting, desktop publishing, digital photography, photo editing, and vector drawing.

Music

The children are exploring music of World War I, including the Last Post. They will create their own fanfares and follow musical notation to play short pieces on tuned percussion. We will be preparing songs for our Christingle on 12th December.

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about how and why rules are made, the impact of making our own rules and the consequences when we break them. We will be learning the importance of our Human Rights, the rights of a child and the right to protect our own bodies.

We will then be looking at protecting ourselves and others through first aid, focusing on choking and head injuries.

RE

We will be understanding of Ritual (Ramadan, Eid-ul-Fitr, Hindu rights of passage and Death ceremonies) and thinking about how these can apply to our life.

French

In French the children will learn the difference between masculine, feminine and plural nouns about masculine and plural nouns . They will use this knowledge to describe items commonly found in a house as well as play a game in French.

Reading

Starting with Michael Morpurgo's 'Private Peaceful', we will continue to explore difficult themes whilst developing key skills like retrieval, inference and summary.

Maths

In maths we will continue our unit that focusses on our four operations (multiplication, division, addition and subtraction) as well as investigating key concepts in fractions and geometry.

We will continue working on our arithmetic skills.

History

In History we will begin learning about the Romans—who they were and how and why the Roman army invaded so many places. We will focus on the Roman invasion in Britain under Julius Caesar and other significant Emperors. Additionally we will look at Boudicca's revolt against the Roman Empire and what the Roman's really did for us.

Science

In Science we will be expanding on our knowledge of electricity and circuits to investigate the effect of voltage on the brightness of a lamp or the loudness of a buzzer.

We will then be designing and making a product using our findings.

DT

We will further develop our understanding of circuits from year 4 to create a fairground ride with a specific audience in mind.

we will learn about different sized 'gears', investigate 'direction' and 'speed of rotation', and build working circuits. We will develop 'measuring', 'marking', 'cutting', 'shaping' and 'joining' skills using a range of tools as appropriate.

Using 'Real PE' the children will be working on skills:
