4. TWAL: about E H Shepard and how he illustrated?

We will look at illustrations by E H Shepard and compare how they are similar and different to Beatrix Potter's animal drawings. We will look at how using a pen and ink to draw changes how

you shade a drawing.

When we draw with a pen we have to use lines to shad



1. TWAL: about different styles of mark making

We will look at some of the picture books in our classroom and talk about how they are different. We will talk about the styles of illustrating that we like.



Mark making is when you make shapes and patterns out of circles, lines or any shape you want!




5. TWAL: to plan and draw our final illustration.
