Eva Rothschild is an Irish artist who uses different materials to make shapes!



Gregory Euclide makes 3D paintings by adding different materials to his artworks.

4. TWAL: different ways to decorate a clay sculpture.

In this lesson we will choose how to decorate our clay.



Sometimes we can decorate with paint and sometimes we can apply extra things with glue.



1. TWAL: what a sculpture is.

We will learn what a sculpture is by looking at a range of artists and comparing them.















5. TWAL: About the sculptures of Gregory Euclide.

We will look at some of Gregory Euclide's Installations and look at how he has added things to a painting to make it a sculpture.

We will paint a picture inspired by Gregory Euclide, and add natural materials from the nature garden to make it into a 3D piece of art.



2. TWAL: about the sculptures of Eva Rothschild.

We will find out more about Eva Rothschild and look at some of the sculptures she has made. We will try and work out what kinds of shapes she uses in her sculptures. We will have a go at making some of our own using craft straws.





6. TWAL: to evaluate our understanding of sculpture and the artwork we have created this half term.

We will evaluate our artwork and decide what we liked, what skills we have learned and what we will improve next time.



Great artists can say what they like and what they would do better next time!

3. TWAL: to mould clay into different shapes.

We will experiment with clay and find out how to mould it into simple shapes. We will find out what water does to clay and how we can use it to make our sculptures better. We will have a go at pinching and pressing our clay to make a shape



We can use water to smooth our clay and stop it from drying out and cracking.
