
Art Year 2 Autumn 1 Andy Warhol Concept: pattern

Pop art was a movement in the 1960's where artists used popular culture like actors and TV shows in their art.



Andy Warhol was probably the most famous Pop Artist of his time. He created a lot of repeating patterns of logos and people.

4. TWAL: to use printing to create a repeating pattern.

We are going to learn about relief printing and how to use a roller and foam board to make a pattern. We will make a practise square so we can see how deep we need to make our impressions so they so appear when we add paint to them.



1. TWAL: What a pattern is and how it can be used in art.

We will learn about what a pattern is in art. We will look at different ways you can make a pattern such as through shapes, repetition and colour. We will look for patterns around us in the school



Patterns are made by repetition of shape or colour.



5. TWAL: to design and create a printing block inspired by one of Andy Warhol's artworks

We are going to design our final print and then make a repeating pattern inspired by the artwork of Andy Warhol. We will make sure we use bright colours.

We can repeat through shape, colour or image



2. TWAL: about the history of Pop Art.

We will look into a kind of art which has a lot of pattern in it called Pop Art. We will talk about what we like and don't like. We will look at the different ways Pop Art can be made.



Pop Art is known for its bright colours and images of famous people and characters.



6. TWAL: to evaluate our final artwork.

We will evaluate our artwork and decide what we liked, what skills we have learned and what we will improve next time.



Great artists can say what they like and what they would do better next time!

3. TWAL: about the artworks of Andy Warhol.

We will find out more about Andy Warhol and look at some of the repeating prints he made. We will try and work out what kinds of subjects he chose and learn how he managed to make pictures that repeated
