Summer 1

English

We will be reading The London Eye Mystery and The Highwayman. Through this text the children will develop their persuasive writing skills.

French

The French national identity card (French: carte nationale d'identité or CNI) is an official identity document consisting of an electronic ID-1 card bearing a photograph, name and address. While the identity card is noncompulsory, all persons must possess some form of valid government lissued identity documentation.

Music

In music lessons with Mrs Thompsett, the children will be exploring the Building Blocks of Music - beat, rhythm and melody. They will play and compose their own short pieces, using music notation and create performances of these.

PSHE

We will learn how to identify and manage different feelings and emotions within the 'Positive Mental Health' theme of our PSHE Education. We will recognise that physical health and mental health are interlinked and that it is normal to experience a range of emotions at different times.

RE

Explore the concepts we have learnt so far this year (peace, interpretation, suffering, symbols). Children discuss their understanding of each of these concepts.

Reading

We will continue to develop our reading aloud skills ensuring we use intonation and expression. We will also work on our vocabulary and inference skills.

Maths

The children will be looking at:

- Fractions
- Decimals and percentages

Geography

In this unit, children will explore the world as a whole, looking at time zones and cities, before zooming in to look at North America and then New York. They will compare it to London and consider where they would most like to live or visit.

Science

We will be exploring the wonderful world of lifecycles and processes of reproduction in both plants and animals.

DT

Outdoor classrooms represent an excellent opportunity for schools and other educational establishments to do something creative and interesting with their outdoor spaces. Outdoor learning has also become a fundamental part of a school's education programme. An outdoor learning structure is a place where children can learn come rain or shine.
