Literacy—Writing

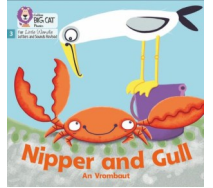
- This term we will be continuing to practice our letter formation so that we can continue to try apply our phonic knowledge when writing labels, lists and moving on to sentences.

We will also be practicing writing our names, putting a capital letter only at the beginning.



Literacy—Reading

The children will continue their Little Wandle book reading adventures—look in book bags for a book matched to their reading ability! We will share stories and non-fiction texts based around life-cycles and change. We will also be reading lots of traditional tales and learning to verbally retell them using story language such as 'Once upon a time'.



Phonics

With 'Little Wandle' Phonics children will:

- We will begin teaching Phase 4 of the Little Wandle programme. Children will learn to read words with adjacent consonants, e.g. **went** and **help**.
- We will also learn the new tricky words, including: **said, so, have, like, come, some, love, do**.

Maths

- We will be focusing on deepening our understanding of the numbers up to 10 including learning the number bonds to 10, for example $5+5=10$, $4+6=10$, $3+7=10$, $2+8=10$ and $1+9=10$.
- We will also be learning doubles and halves to 10, e.g. $1+1=2$, $2+2=4$, $3+3=6$.
- We will spend time using practical resources (counters / blocks / gems) to find these and then will focus on supporting the children with being able to instantly recall these number facts.

Understanding the World

- We will be watching tadpoles grow in our garden and observing the life cycle of a caterpillar in our classrooms.
- Later in the term, we will be visiting Longdown Activity Farm.

PSED

- We will be talking about our school value, 'Empowerment' and what this means to them.
- We will look for examples of children demonstrating 'empowerment' in Discovery Time.

Expressive Art and Design

- In their Music lessons with Mrs Thompsett, the children will sing songs about animals and will explore the difference between high and low sounds using their voices, bodies and instruments.

PE and PD

Using 'Real PE' the children will be working on : **Physical Skills**

In our PE lessons we will be recapping the body shapes we learned last half term in gymnastics and learning new dance skills like joining our shapes together with movements.
