Literacy—Writing

We are well underway with our Drawing Club journey. The children's imagination has become more and more creative, always surprising us with their inventive codes to make something 'happen' to their drawings. We have seen development in both the will for wanting to put pen to paper and the skill of mark making for a purpose and writing cvc words. We will continue to develop our writing skills, using sounds that we have learnt to write exciting codes.



Literacy— Reading

In reading, we have continued to work on decoding, prosody and fluency. Some children are beginning to read words in books, focusing on the skill of segmenting and blending.

If your child is still on worded books, we have created some 'busy pictures' so that your child doesn't have the same books repeatedly. These busy pictures follow the same format as the books, shown on the back. Please use these with your child to replace the books as we can make these both relevant and exciting for the children.



Phonics

With 'Little Wandle' Phonics children will:



- Recap all sounds learned so far.
- Continue to learn to blend sounds together to read words.
- Learn some digraphs (two letters, one sound): ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er
- Learn words with double letters: dd, mm, tt, bb, rr, gg, pp, ff
- We will learn how to read longer words, such as 'power' and 'farmyard'
- Recap previously learned tricky words: put, pull, full, as, and, has, his, her, go, no, to, into, she, push, he, of, we, be, me, I, is
- Learn new tricky words: was, you, they, my, by, all, are, sure, pure

Maths

- In maths, we are continuing to learn about counting, ordinality and cardinality. This is when we recognise that the last number that we count tells us how many there are. We are continuing to look at why counting is useful and begin to order numbers and amounts.
- We are continuing to see smaller groups within a larger amount, such as "I can see 1 and 1 in two!".
- We will also look at more/less and comparing amounts.



Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- We have continued to work on developing friendships that we have created and using our words to navigate problems and conflicts.
- We are have been talking a lot about how we are feeling and the perspective of others.

Understanding the World

We have begun 'Our Wonderful World' lesson after lunch. This is when we talk about events that are happening currently around the world and celebrations from different cultures. We've even learnt to say hello in different languages!

Expressive Art and Design

Music sessions with Mrs Thompsett—playing instruments and learning songs about Spring. We will look at tempo and loud or quiet sounds.

PE and PD Using 'Real PE' the children will be working on :

- Listen to and follow simple instructions.
- Applying their dynamic balance on a line and stance through focused thematic stories, songs and games.
